Hello SESRA:

Concourse takes Poole Cup in first four-way contest; LifeTime notches its first win...

Concourse Athletic Club captured the Poole Cup, Atlanta's annual 15-person interclub team competition, defeating the Piedmont Driving Club 13-2 and Midtown Athletic Club 10-5 at the CAC on Saturday, May 21.

The Poole Cup, which has been held annually (sort of) since 2004, is named for Keith Poole, an avid Atlanta squash player. Keith was known for his competitive and sometimes argumentative spirit on the court and the event seems to have borne the stamp of his character since the beginning. The Poole Cup has always been hotly contested but also greatly enjoyed as a gathering of the Atlanta squash clan, and this year was no exception.

For the first time, a four way event included CAC, Midtown, the PDC and LifeTime Fitness in a knockout format that ran 60 matches dawn to dusk on Concourse's four courts. While the first round results – Concourse defeating PDC and Midtown defeating LifeTime 11-4 – were as predicted, the second round was anybody's guess. In the end, the depth of the CAC team under captain Justin Mather was too much for Midtown's 15 and LifeTime posted their first Poole Cup win against the Driving Club by a 9-6 margin. Full scoresheets are at the back of this letter.

Great matches were much in evidence. The LifeTime team was anchored at the top by the three Saleem brothers, who played their six matches with only one loss. Arhum, currently ranked fifth nationally in the BU17, defeated both Diniar Alikhan and Allen Post in one day... a pretty good performance. Older brother Nabil handled John Mahorner and Todd Knutson without loss of a game. Danial took a win from Trey Paris and barely missed a win against Midtown's Michael Gilman. Gilman, down 9-5 in the fifth, rallied to win 17-15.

In the CAC-MAC dustup, Diniar squeaked out a 3-2 win over David Perry to give MAC its only point in the top three divisions. Aaron Luque took a five-game Donnybrook from Tom deLange and Alejandro Caipa caught out Guri Ben-Hashal in five as well. In the <3.5 division, Trevor Yossowitz took two 3-0 wins to post an unblemished record for the weekend.

LifeTime/PDC saw real strength in the middle of the PDC order as Mssrs. Rollauer, Green and Winter took their matches without loss of a game. In future, watch John Winter carefully as I predict he will spend only a little time in brackets that begin with a 4. Elsewhere, LifeTime produced a strong



performance from Pritesh Patel with two wins (one including a particularly unusual let call at match point the other way), and wins in the <3.5 from Prashant Devaraju and Uzma Saleem.

All in all, a splendid time, a great competition to watch or play in and a fine end to the Atlanta squash season.

Atlanta National Champions: Gough and Hardie

Atlanta's Michael Gough won the national 70s title at the U.S. Masters in March. Gough defeated longtime rival Warren Young in three to gain his 5th national title.

Eben Hardie and partner Jamie Heldring repeated as national 50s doubles champions, coming from the second seed slot to defeat Canadians Fred Reed and Alan Hunt in the final: 11,11,4.

Back in the age group singles, LifeTime pro Andre Maur finished third in the 45s, losing in the semis to rival Dominic Hughes and defeating Garrett Beeson in three for the third slot. Also in the 45s, Charlotte's Geoff Roper lost to Portland's Sean Ryan in four in the second round.

In the 60s, Michael Kilgallon lost in four to eventual champ Don Sheer from Sedona, AZ.

In the women's 55s, Charleston's Pat Millman finished third, running off two wins before losing to champion Elaine Hinnegan in four.

U.S. Squash also introduced a new format for the Skill Level Championships, consisting of a required regional qualifier for the tournament. Held this year at LifeTime Fitness in John's Creek, the qualifier produced several local champions who went on to challenge at the nationals in April in Pennsylvania.

In the national 3.0s, Prashant Devaraju lost in the second round to Janvier Chalopin in three.

In the 3.5s, Rob Armstrong lost his first round match in four to Chris Ensey of Baltimore. Durham, N.C.'s Nasim Maimoon dropped his second round match to Yen Tan in three.

In the 4.0s, Charleston's David Lewin finished third, winning two rounds before dropping to national winner John Ghublikian from Dorchester Mass, 7,(7),5,(6),6. Also, Pritesh Patel dropped his first round match against Ghublikian in three.

In the 4.5s, Chattanooga's Markus Englemann finished third, losing to Max Reed in the semis.

In the 5.0s, Atlanta's junior Arhum Saleem played a tough five game match against John Sayward, (7),(9),7,11,3.

In the 5.5s, Justin Mather wore out Zach Bradley from Baltimore before falling (9),9,(8),8,10 in the first round. Bradley went on to finish third.

In the women's 3.0, Uzma Saleem finished fourth, winning her first round match against Dorothy Kim. Catherine Cobb played a tough four game contest against Sara Smyth.

In the national juniors, Atlanta's competitive junior family, the Saleems, took on the world at the U.S. Junior Championships at Yale in March.



Arhum, in the BU17, won two matches before dropping to Hayes Murphy of Greenwich after a grueling 5-gamer against Atticus Kelly of Hartford.

In the BU19, Danial Saleem won his first match, but dropped to third place finisher Nicholas Schreiber of Philadelphia. In its fourth year of recognition, the William T. Ketcham Award, which acknowledges one female and one male ranked junior squash competitor who have demonstrated tremendous dedication and growth throughout the season, honored Danial and Sabrina Sobhy of Sea Cliff, NY for their on-court improvement. He'll be going to Columbia University in NYC in the fall.

Also in the 19s, Nabil Saleem was stopped by Thomas Dembinski in three in the first round. Nabil, 40th in the BU19, is headed to Bates College in Lewiston, Maine this fall.

Also, Atlanta junior Neel Swami is off to Brown in Providence, RI this fall. Lots of SESRA squash yet to come at the collegiate level.
